History of Rock and Roll

Since the 1950's, Rock and Roll has had a major influence on world culture. In the early years of music's transformation from acoustic to electric instruments, television played a major role in bringing this new style of music to audiences around the globe. Some musicians incorporated different cultural influences into their music, while others used their fame and fortune to help shed light and raise money for victims of social injustice and famine.

This class will look at the history of Rock and Roll from the 1950's to the early 2000's. We will discuss television shows such as American Band Stand with Dick Clark, the Ed Sullivan Show, Saturday Night Live, as well as other programs that had banner breakout performances. We will discuss Elvis, Beatlemania and other British influences, the Woodstock Festivals, and Live Aid. We will look at how MTV changed the Rock and Roll industry in the 1980's and 1990's. We will touch on how Rock and Roll has influenced other styles of music and fashion. We will finish the semester by discussing the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland, OH.

Meet the Instructor



Scott Hoelldobler: Scott's passion for music began with trumpet at age 7. He listened to his parents' transistor radio in the backyard. He heard artists such as Herb Alpert and Chuck Mangione on his father's 8-track hi-fi. His own musical taste developed and he watched his best friends perform in the school auditorium and has been hooked on live music ever since. He began playing guitar and going to concerts regularly (**more than 500 since 1984!**).

He has seen most of the great Rock Stars from the 60's, 70's and 80's live, including The Who, Pink Floyd, The Police, Van Halen, Elton John, Rolling Stones, David Bowie and CSNY, to name a few.

He drove with friends to Philadelphia in 1987 to see Amnesty International - A Concert to End Apartheid, a significant experience for him. Road trips to shows were permanently etched into his soul and he has gone to as many as 5 shows in one week! He has studied the influences of rock legends such as Eric Clapton, Jeff Beck, Eddie Van Halen, and Carlos Santana (and was even a roadie for a day for Meat Loaf).

Scott is excited to share the History of Rock and Roll with you through a multi-media format, sharing his personal experiences and learning from the experiences of his students.
